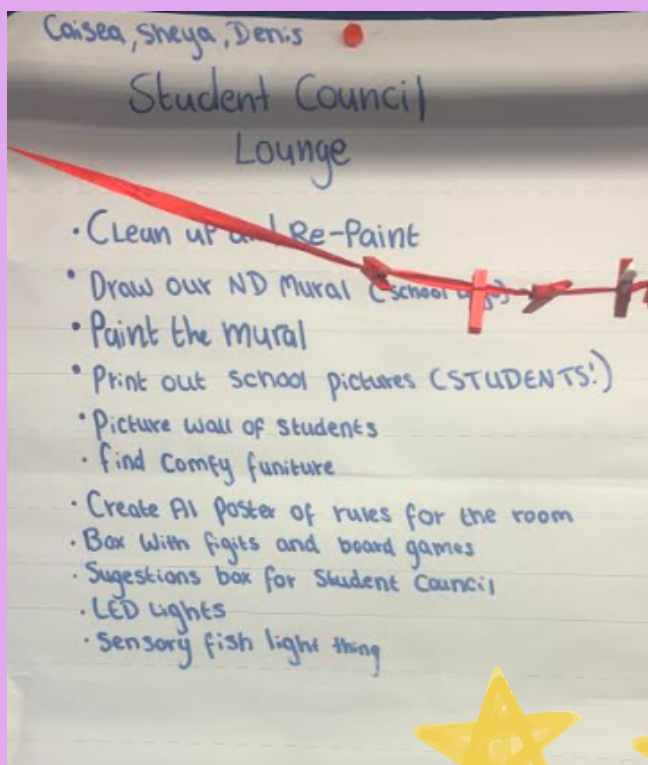

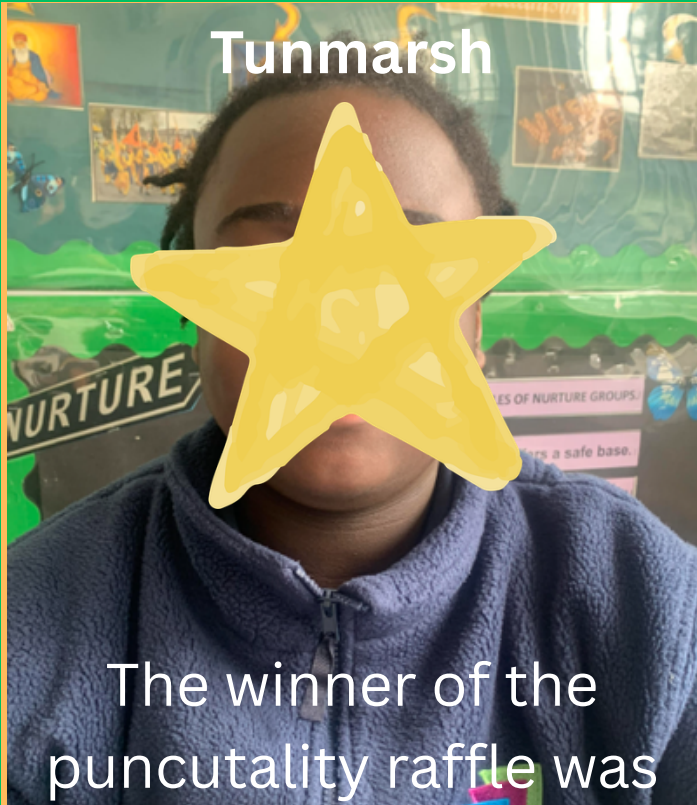

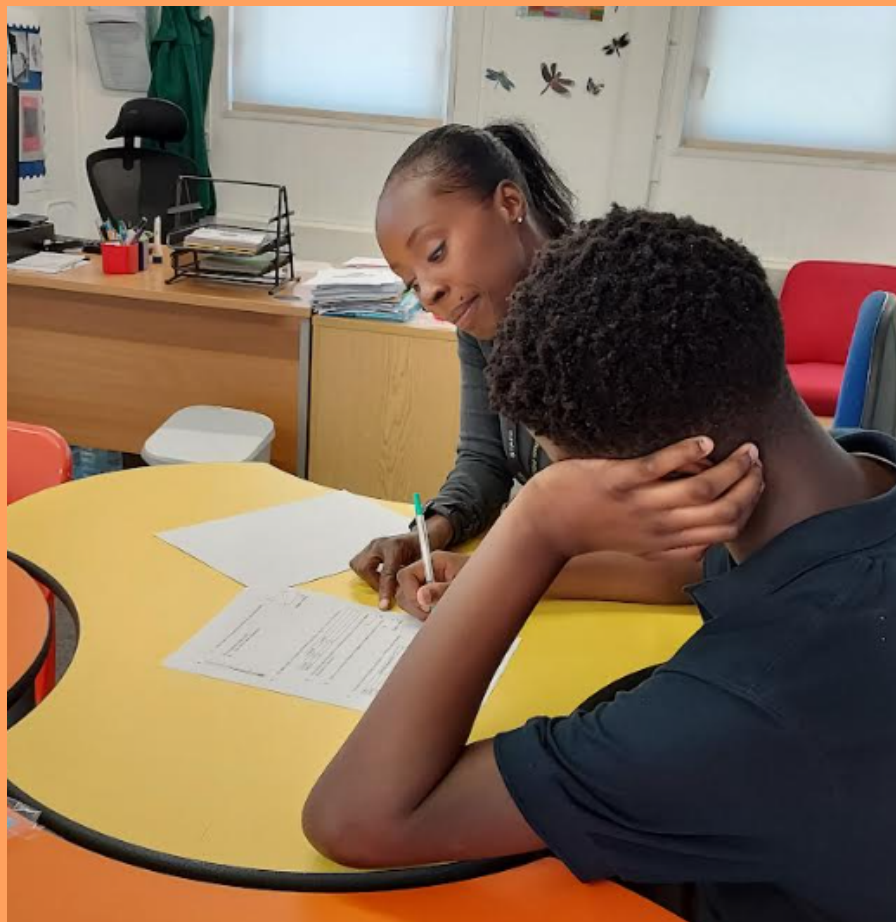

We will contact you to offer support (meetings, home visits) if attendance is poor. Continued, poor attendance is referred to Newham and can ultimately lead to an **Attendance Panel Hearing** and potential legal action, including significant fines, under the Education Act 1996.

WHY ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Regular attendance supports learning, wellbeing, safety and future opportunities.



EVERY SESSION COUNTS

PUNCTUALITY

PENALTY NOTICE THRESHOLD

10 unauthorised sessions within 10 school weeks

First notice: £160, reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.
Second notice within 3 years: £160.
Further offences may lead to prosecution.



A penalty notice is not an automatic fine. Each case will be considered, and we will take into account the family's circumstances before any action is taken.

Tell us early if illness, anxiety, transport or family circumstances are affecting attendance. We will listen, offer support and work with you.

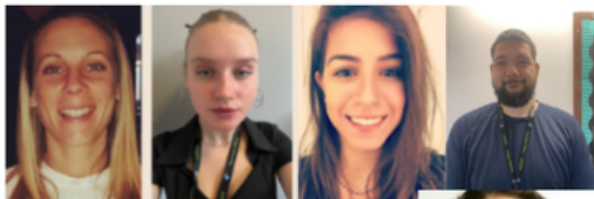

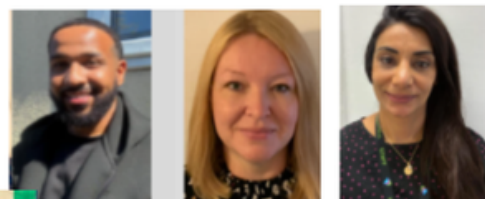
WHO'S WHO IN NEWHAM PRUS SAFEGUARDING TEAM?

SPEAK TO US IF...

A student discloses information to you about physical, sexual or emotional abuse.

A student discloses information to you about self-harm or neglect.

You suspect abuse or have concerns at all about a student.

Medical Needs: Information for Parents

If your child has a medical condition or health need, please inform our SENCO, Yasmine Dhillon.

Having accurate and up-to-date information is essential to ensure your child remains safe at school and that we can respond quickly and effectively in the event of an emergency.

Please note the following requirements regarding specific health conditions:

- **Severe Allergies:** Pupils must have an official Allergy Action Plan, alongside two in-date EpiPens and any prescribed antihistamines stored together in the medical room.
- **Mild or Moderate Allergies:** Pupils must have an official Allergy Action Plan on file.
- **Asthma:** Pupils must have an Asthma Action Plan specifying their prescribed pump colour. Their designated inhaler must be kept in the medical room.
- **Epilepsy & Complex Conditions:** Pupils requiring specialised support must have an up-to-date Individual Health Care Plan on file so staff can follow agreed emergency protocols.

Medication Administration: If your child requires medication to be administered during school hours, a parent or carer must complete an "Administering Medication in School" form with our First Aid team.
